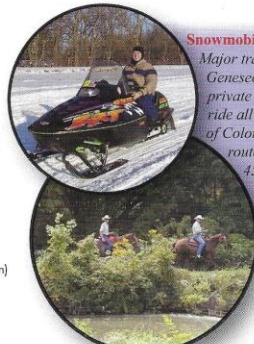

Snowmobiling-

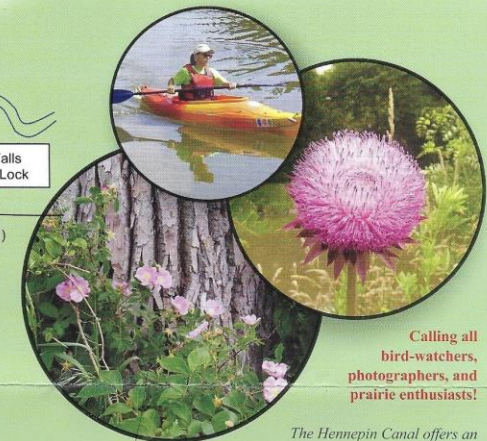

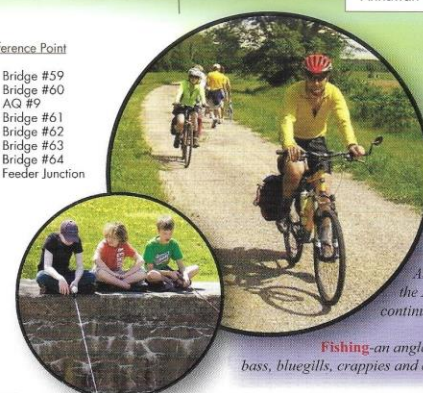

Calling all bird-watchers, photographers, and prairie enthusiasts!

The Hennepin Canal offers an Eco-system assortment. Some are man-made others have been allowed to occur naturally as the acreage transformed from a grazed, almost treeless corridor in the 1940s to an extremely diverse environment today. It is now a tree-lined refuge through predominantly corn and bean country and includes various prairie areas, drainages, wetlands and waterways of different types with a diversity of plants, insects, animals, and birds.



Bicycling - 91-mile hard surfaced trail connecting communities along the canal and a vital link in the American Discovery Trail, a bicycle network from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pacific Ocean. The network continues with the 450-mile Grand Illinois Trail.

Fishing - an angler's delight! Canal water teams with largemouth bass, bluegills, crappies and catfish.
